



IUYA Statement on TPS ending for Haitians and Syrians

By now, you've heard the news. The U.S. Supreme Court has cleared the way for the Trump administration to end Temporary Protected Status for hundreds of thousands of Haitian and Syrian immigrants. Behind every legal decision are real people, parents, workers, students, neighbors, and community leaders who have built their lives here, raised their families here, and contributed to the communities they call home.

We are furious. And you should be too.

The Indiana Undocumented Youth Alliance (IUYA) condemns this decision without hesitation. This is not policy. This is cruelty. We will not normalize it, we will not accept it, and we will not stop fighting.

To our Haitian and Syrian brothers and sisters: we see you, we stand with you, and we are not going anywhere.

- **Family Support Fund:** Financial assistance is available for eligible undocumented and mixed-status families across Indiana facing immigration-related emergencies.
- **Know Your Rights Resources:** Access trusted Know Your Rights materials, including ACLU resources, information on interactions with ICE, and guidance for immigrant families.

- **Trusted Immigration Attorneys:** Our website includes a list of vetted immigration attorneys who may be able to help you explore legal options based on your individual circumstances. We encourage anyone affected by this decision not to make immigration decisions based on rumors or social media. Every case is different. Speak with a trusted immigration attorney or accredited legal service provider before taking action.
